

Looking forward there are a few challenges for the Colleagues. The completion of the new Clubhouse is a top priority as well as the up grading of the playing surface. On the competition level the payment of players by other clubs through many of the Subdistrict Divisions is becoming far more prevalent with administrators seemingly happy to let this situation continue believing that it will sort itself out. What that means for our club in future years is hard to determine but something we need to be prepared for. And finally Colleagues needs to develop a sustainable program for Colts into the future as they are worth as much as Whiddon in club championship points.
