


Club Coach Report

2016 was another outstanding year for the Blue Giants across the club. Further with all teams making the finals shows we were very competitive at all levels in what was a disjointed and short season given Division 1 being whittled down to 8 teams. With a similar story of brilliant attacking football backed up with a defence attitude that usually left teams wondering how they would get through. If you look across the senior grades for the regular season, there were a total of 7 games lost between kick off and the finals starting. 5 in Kentwell, and two in Burke. With those type of stats you can image the points for were significant and to show we are a well-rounded club, the points against were pretty low. 
Thank you for the honour of being club coach, it is a pleasure and something I hold very dear.


Finally to Goochie, mate none of us have words enough

The season itself always felt somewhat a *fait accompli*. From the moment subbies ruled out blokes getting some pocket money for their troubles, the elite few were bound to rise to













Barbour Cup Report

There were very few returning faces from the triumphant 2015 Colts team, despite the ageless Jack Williams going around again. This roster change is part of what makes Barbour Cup such an enjoyable challenge as every year the slate is wiped clean. For the players it's a whole new set of banter with new friends on and off the field, and for the coaches it's a chance to cast your eye over the pretty fillies that come to watch.

The 2016 season really was composed of two halves. The account book was opened with a string of wins (5 from 6 games). In the opening rounds we relied on flair and fortune as there was a lack of definitive combinations or established structure. Yet as the wins kept coming the confidence grew. In those early weeks Ollie Martin gave the team impressive go-forward through mid-field, while Lochie Condon directed play as the essential link between the backs and forwards.

The two games that stand out in the early period were a 55-24 win against Balmain in round 4 where Lochie McTier and Hamish Fuller both crossing for doubles. Yet the Petersham game under lights in round 6 was the most enthralling contest.
