## PRESIDENT'S REPORT

We are in somewhat of a catch-22 situation in that until we are assured of approval of the building of the new clubhouse in Council's plan of management, the committee does not feel that it is appropriate to commence fundraising as if for some reason Council finally do not wish to go ahead with the clubhouse project we would be left holding substantial funds raised on a false premise.

You can rest assured that I will be pursuing Council in the new year to get a final determination on when the plan of management will be approved including the clubhouse project.

I thank everyone for their support during the 1999 season, especially all those Old Colleagues who attend games whether it be at home or away. You can rest assured that your support does not go unnoticed. Thanking you in anticipation for your continued support.
